

Released this past August, Catherine is the first volume in a trilogy entitled "The Volga Flows Forever" by Sigrid Weidenweber. Catherine brings to life the fascinating historical character of Catherine the Great who invited her native countrymen to settle the Russian frontier. In volume two, entitled The Volga Germans and available December 10th, these German immigrants and descendants convert the harsh steppe into fields of waving grain dotted with wind-driven flour mills and develop a culture that is uniquely their own. In the final volume, From Gulag to Freedom, coming out in April 2009, Sigrid follows the Volga Germans through the hardships of Soviet collectivization and deportation to finally immigrate to the San Joaquin Valley of Central California.
