Special thanks to Marilyn Schultz who has graciously decided to join the board. But we need more!




Upcoming Events

April Chapter Meeting

In April, we screened a video donated to the chapter by the Plaggenhacke (http://www.plaggenhacke.de) association in Germany. They are a group similar to AHSGR but focused on the settlers to Schleswig around 1761, many of whom went on to the Volga a few years later. The video is in German, alternating between a speaker discussing the migration of the colonists and a folk music duo performing songs about the colonists.

After the video, Carole Hayden provided a walkthrough of accessing German-Russian related video resources online through PBS (mainly Prairie Public Broadcasting productions).


